



Tanya C. Bergen Memorial Scholarship

TERMS OF REFERENCE

- Purpose:** To provide financial assistance and recognize high academic performance of undergraduate students who have graduated from a Saskatchewan high school entering any degree program at the University of Saskatchewan.
- Source and Amount of Funding:** An annual donation of \$2,000 from the Saskatchewan Mutual Insurance Company in memory of Tanya C. Bergen, BA 1999, an admired missed and lamented employee who passed away tragically in 2003.
- Additional contributions by family and friends of Tanya Bergen may be made to the scholarship fund.
- The University of Saskatchewan must receive the funds by June 1 each year.
- Tenability:** The award will remain in existence for five years and thereafter at the discretion of the donor. The University requests one year's prior notification before termination of the scholarship.
- The first award will be made in 2004-2005.
- Designation of Award Committee:** University of Saskatchewan's Scholarships and Awards Committee.
- Number and Value of Awards:** One scholarship valued at a minimum of \$2,000 will be available annually. The award value may be increased dependent on financial resources available, as determined by the Awards Committee.
- Program and Course Designations and Eligibility Restrictions:** Open to students who have graduated from a Saskatchewan high school who are proceeding directly to their first year of study at the University of Saskatchewan.
- To be eligible, students must have completed secondary-level standing with a minimum academic average of 85%, as determined by the Award Committee.
- Selection Criteria:** Selection will be made on the basis of financial need as determined by the Award Committee.

It is hereby acknowledged that the above terms are acceptable and are in keeping with the intent of the gift.
